- Provides renewed urgency to EPA's message of reducing, reusing and recycling valuable materials habitually discarded by American industry and the general public
- Links the importance of these activities to energy conservation and GHG reductions

- Expand markets for organic materials commercial sales, government agencies (DOTs), beneficial land applications
- Demonstrate and develop new technologies for processing woody biomass into clean energy

Region 4 Landfill Specialty Team

• Function: Provide assistance to state and local governments to assure proper management and disposition of disaster debris, with focus on proper segregation and land disposal practices

• Pre-Incident:

- Training
- Evaluation of R4 states' needs to determine and prioritize assistance in planning and preparedness
- Share/disseminate pertinent information on planning and preparing for disaster debris management

LST Post-Incident Assistance

- Reconnaissance; establish communications; evaluate needs of state and local governments
- Assist with hydrogeologic assessments of proposed land disposal sites
- Establish monitoring protocol with state solid waste permitting/compliance program(s)
- Monitor demolition debris disposal sites for proper management practices and presence of prohibited materials
- Perform specific duties including documentation and reporting responsibilities as previously described)

Pre-Incident Assistance

- Assistance to state solid waste management programs as related to large-scale disaster debris preparedness:
 - Models/templates for pre-incident draft document preparation (Guidance and policy; Permits and temporary authorizations)
 - Dissemination of valuable information (e.g., R4 Disaster Debris Resource Guide: organizations and associations, salvaged material and recycling databases, exchanges and directories, available guidance documents, landfill databases)
 - Case studies, issues and past experiences of other states (FL, MS, LA, NC, SC, et.al.)
