# Discussion Summary:

Tom Harbour – heard proposals for edits – **Page 34** from Ann Walker – **Page 70** from Larry Mastick.

Bill Kaage – given the discussion, we need to understand (page **59)** what we mean by increased short term risks andhow much of that section is about balancing short term risks with long term benefits

#### Jim Erickson-

- Some observations and heads up on some concerns we are going to see. Some counties
  that are flagged on certain maps make no sense and we need to be prepared on how to
  respond to them.
- Page **36** concerned about some of the language –includes mechanical and chemical thinning, but we don't talk about utilization.
- Page 37 fourth paragraph a couple of sentences that should be removed sound forest management is implied throughout the whole document.
- Talked about mechanical as use where fire is not desired, however, mechanical may be a precursor to other treatments where fire use is an option..
- Page 38 third paragraph we talk about where markets are available, but we don't talk
  about the opportunities within the paragraphs. That could be a key part to solving the
  problem.
- Page **48** concerned about human ignitions and how we reduce ignitions how do we get those people that want to burn to do it appropriately and ultimately result in benefit.
- Page 49 talk about local response capacity as being generally adequate...However, we
  are finding the succession of resource managers trending down don't know how we are
  going to maintain capacity out to the future.
