




- Transportation Fuels for the Future



- 08-02 Transportation Fuels for the West: A Roadmap for Energy Security and Improving the Environment and the Economy (February 2008)
- Western Governors established a Council of their representatives to oversee the implementation of the resolution
 - Council will develop an implementation plan and report progress back to the Western Governors in 2009
 - The Council's activities are focused on education, outreach, and coordination among states and with the federal government



- Western Strategic Bioenergy Assessment




Goal: To develop a biomass supply chain optimization model for the Western United States

- □Provide a projection for the role that biofuels could play in the West by 2015
- □Inform policies and steps that can be taken to encourage the development and deployment of biofuels.
- □The model is now being expanded to the national level in a project led by WGA and funded by DOE

Building Transmission for Renewables in the West

 The goal of the Western Renewable Energy Zone (WREZ) initiative is to develop a consensus proposal among the states and provinces in the Western Interconnection on how best to develop and deliver energy from renewable resource areas throughout the region to load centers.



GENERAL RECOMMENDATIONS:

- ➤Increase communication with partners, collaborate on projects, achieve a higher focus on assisting states & communities
- Strengthen reporting to chartered organizations, such as the Wildland Fire Leadership Council, the National/Regional Biomass Partnerships, and the WGA
- ➤ Seek additional funding and recognition for WBUG program and state projects
